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SCHOOL CODE OF CONDUCT POLICY - PARENTS

The School fully supports the principles of fair discipline and the consistent application of appropriate disciplinary measures where necessary.

The Code of Conduct for children indicates the broad standards of behaviour that are expected of all children at the school, and encourages a responsible and self-disciplined approach by the children themselves.

Should expected norms of conduct not be met by any child, corrective action will be initiated by the School's Management. This may or may not include the application of formal disciplinary measures to restore the teacher / child relationship to prevent further occurrences of the unacceptable behaviour.

The Code of Conduct may also have a bearing on a child's behaviour outside of normal school hours, should the conduct impact negatively on the teacher / child relationship or the reputation and integrity of the School.

Parents

Parents enroll their children at the School, subject to their acceptance of the School rules and other conditions of enrolment.

Parents also have the responsibility to:

- Ensure that their child arrives punctually for School activities.
- Ensure that their child is collected punctually at the appropriate time.
- Ensure that their child attends all school days, relevant functions and activities.
- Ensure that the child is appropriately dressed and groomed according to the school rules.
- Actively support the efforts of the School and its teachers to teach their child.
- Involve themselves to the fullest possible extent in School activities.
- Make positive suggestions and contributions to improve the School's education process and the learning environment.
- Encourage their child to respect the dignity and self-worth of others and to support the school in its zero tolerance towards bullying.

- Take responsibility to manage and monitor their child's internet and social media communication.
- Support the disciplinary structures and procedures of the School and the reasonable efforts by the School to apply discipline effectively and fairly.
- Encourage their child to participate fully in School and extra-mural activities.
- Participate in the learning process and assist their child with homework, provide encouragement, check results and communicate freely with the School.
- Not expect the School to meet their child's every need.

While parents must expect the School and its teachers to provide the best education possible with the resources available to the School, parents must also accept responsibility to help the School achieve this goal.
